# **1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

# **1.1 INTRODUCTION**

Barpathar College, one of the Premier Institute of Higher Education in the Dhansiri Sub-Division, was established on 23rd December, 1987, as a Co-Educational Arts College. The College was established with the noble objective of making higher education accessible to those students who otherwise could not pursue it due to their economic disadvantages. Situated in a rural area which is almost 41 K.M. away from the district head quarter, the college nobly tries to illuminate and transform the lives through the strength of knowledge.

The college is permanently affiliated to Dibrugarh University and was provincialised by the Government of Assam under the provincialisation of services act. 2011. Presently, the college offers honours courses in five subjects under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). On the other hand there is Study Centre for B.A. and M.A. under Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU). The college has got approval from Dibrugarh University to start Add-on courses for the Academic session 2022-2023. In brief, the college is relentlessly trying to build nurture and retain a proper atmosphere for higher education amidst the backward and rural population of the area.

#### Vision

To use education as the instrument of social change so that enlightenment of the downtrodden is made sure.

#### Mission

The college strives to impart education of quality and tries to conduct programme which enable one to face the current and future challenges at a personal level as well as a human being at large.

### **1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)**

#### Institutional Strength

(i) The college is located in the area of Assam Nagaland Border, in a small town known as Barpathar, which is a potential region of archeological interest as it was a part ancient Davaka Kingdom. The Kingdom which flourished in the Doiyang-Dhansiri Valley had its capital at Dubarani, which is only 5 K.M. away from Barpathar College.

(xii) Teachers of various departments actively participate in different program in the locality and are involved in social service.

- (ii) A major portion of students hail from poor social-economic background.
- (iii) Less number of digital classrooms stand as the barrier for students.

(iv) High dropout rate of students from multiple reasons, as persuing professional courses, academically weak family background, poverty, early marriage etc.

- (v) Computer lab is not well equipped.
- (vi) Lack of various undergraduate degree programme.
- (vii) Some posts of teachers are yet to be provincialized.

(viii) The post of the librarian is lying vacant.

(ix) There is no lift facility for Divyangjan students

(x) Lack of sports materials.

(xi) No fruitful measure is taken against the raiding monkeys.

#### **Institutional Opportunity**

(i) The college can start Science Stream in near future.

(ii) The faculty members may be benefited by the research facilities offered by various funding agencies.

(iii) As the College is located in a agriculturally rich area, students may be motivated to begin small scale industry based on agricultural products.

(iv) Workshops along with short term courses may be organized to boost the employability on the students.

(v) Due to the location of the College, certificate course on tourism may be introduced.

(vi) To expose students in the field of culture and sports, as it is the land of athletes as Ms. Lovelina Borgohain and Ms. Nayanmoni Saikia.

(vii) To increase environmental awareness among the students with special importance given to the rich biodiversity of Nambor Wild Life Sanctuary which is only 10 k.m. away from the college.

(viii) The college can eliminate the infrastructural inadequacies with financial grants received from RUSA, Govt. of Assam etc.

(ix) As Nambor is the natural habitat of wild elephants and human-elephant conflict is rising alarmingly, a lot should be done towards the peaceful co-existence of both in the forest fringe area.

## **1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY**

#### **Curricular Aspects**

Affiliated to Dibrugarh University, Barpathar College Strictly follows and prepares the academic activities according the academic calendar issued by the University. The College offers UG programme of Arts (BA) in CBCS system with honours on Assamese, Political Science, Economics, Education and Sociology from the session 2019-20. At the beginning of each academic session the college publishes the prospectus that entails all necessary informations. For proper implementation of the syllabus, the class routine is prepared cautiously and the head of each department allots classes to the teachers to make sure their participation. Teachers are instructed to maintain the record of their daily classes in the form of teacher's diary. The college conducts unit test and sessional examination on regular basis to evaluate the performance of students.

Issues related with Human Values, Society, Mental Health, Environment, Gender etc. are taught as a part of syllabus. Feedback is collected from students, employees, parents, alumni and are analysed by a committee so that curriculum review and development may be proceeded accordingly. Students are encouraged to take part in departmental speech competitions, paper and project presentations, field trips, educational tours etc. The college arranges workshops and invited guests from various fields to throw light on academic and non-academic issues. Besides, career oriented programmes are organized in the college by the career counseling cell.

#### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

The admission procedure of the college is executed following the governmental rules and guidelines issued by Dibrugarh University. The institution adopts various students-centric methods as group discussion, classroom interaction, field study, home assignment, extra classes etc. to serve students. Their progress are assessed and monitored through seminars, group discussion, viva-voice and sessional examination. The central library as well as the departmental libraries comply with the curiosity of the students and the staff. Students participate in extra-curricular activities as debating competition, essay competition, speech competition, annual college magazine, departmental magazine. Besides, the faculty members continuously take part in various national and international seminars, workshops, short term courses, Orientation Programme, Refreshers Course, Faculty Induction Programme to update and improve themselves. The institution runs a study centre of Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) which facilitates large number of students to persue study both in PG and UG level.

#### **Research, Innovations and Extension**

Despite infrastructural inadequacies, Barpathar College tries to create a favourable environment for research

and innovation. The Research Committee, which is constituted by the college, plays a pivotal role in encouraging and extending all possible help to the researchers in the field of research. Teachers nurture the culture of presenting research papers in various National and International seminars. Some teachers have contributed chapters, articles in edited books. Besides, seminars are organized by the departments so that students can imbibe this culture.

Shouldering its responsibility towards community services, the college increases students' active participation, though NSS, in programmes as flood relief, cleanliness-drive, tree plantation, road safety awareness etc. The teachers' unit, IQAC, Women cell and NSS observe International Women Day, Human Rights Day, International Yoga Day, International Mother Language Day along with women health awareness programme. Several departments arrange socio-economic surveys and educational tours through which students can assess life and culture history, socio-economic prospect and problems of neighbourhood community. During pandemic the faculty members reached out the poor section of society to assist them. Eminent personalities are invited by the departments to impart speeches on different topics.

Institution tries to create a favorable environment for research innovation and extension activities. Teachers are always encouraged organizing seminar and workshop in the institution and leaves are granted to participate in the same. The institution constituted a research committee to encourage and extend all possible help to the researchers in the field of research. College provide minimum infrastructure facilities for research works. More than 20 faculty member have presented papers in National conference and seminars. Faculty members have presented a good number of research papers in various National seminar in their individual capacity and in collaboration with associated which are publish in the proceeding of the relevant seminars.

The college is also involved in extensive activities in different categories like community development, social works, health awareness, environmental, awareness, gender sensitization and ensures students active participation. The NSS unit, Women Cell and also IQAC organize extension programmes like cleaning, tree plantation and other social works.

#### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The college campus encompasses 5.47 acre of land, where, the total built up area is 1368.68 sq.mts. The college is functioning with the grants and aids from Government of Assam, personal donations and to some extent, its own resources. The college provides sufficient and spacious classrooms with adequate number of desks and benches, electricity and smart boards. The entire college campus is under CCTV surveillance.

The central library, which accommodates more than three thousand books, is supported by SOUL. Thus far, the college has one ICT classrooms, departmental laboratory for education, one girls common room, one boys common room, a play ground, one generator set, a canteen, drinking water purifier, a boys hostel and some other facilities. The college auditorium is under construction.

#### **Student Support and Progression**

The college seeks to serve the students with the best of the facilities to make sure their holistic development. First, the College organise student induction programme to make themselves aware for the B.A. programme where students enrolled themselves. Secondly, The prospectus, which is published annually, entails all necessary information, such as admission procedure and course structure, facility provided, rules of the institution etc. Moreover information about various scholarships is displayed in college website and college notice board. Students' union actively participate in various activities of the college.

The college provides free admission for the economically weaker and divyangjan students. In addition to the government's schemes, college fraternity extends monetary help to the needy students. Students are counselled through students mentoring system. The career counselling committee arranges programmes which are beneficial for their career related issues. Some faculty members provide career guidance to the students, at a personal level. Extra classes are taken by all the departments. Feedbacks are collected from the students and are analyzed by a feedback analysis committee. The college has constituted a committee on grievances and redressal for students. Anti-Sexual harassment committee and anti-ragging committee execute programmes that ensure proper academic atmosphere. Students are involved through National Social Service (NSS) in activities as flood relief, cleanliness, tree plantation etc. Besides the college celebrates Republic Day, Independence Day, International Yoga Day, International Mother Language Day, Human Rights Day, Lachit Borphukan 400th Birth Anniversary etc.

#### Governance, Leadership and Management

A democratic, decentralized, participative, transparent management is opted by the college for effective decision making and enactment of the same. As per the Organogram of the College, the Governing Body is supreme authority regarding administrative and academic aspects and as the Principal functions as its Secretary, he plays a pivotal role in the governance and management of the college.

The Principal involves all the stakeholders in various committees /cells like IQAC, Grievance and Redressal Committee, Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee, Anti-Ragging Committee, Construction Committee etc. for the smooth functioning of the college. The IQAC of Barpathar College was establish in the year - 20th April 2017. The IQAC leaves no stone unturned in effective planning, execution, sustenance, monitoring programmes that can bring Barpathar College close to its desired dream of holistic academic excellence.

The management always encourages the teaching and non-teaching staff to participate in activities which can enhance their competence. The efficacy of the staff is assured by the performance appraisal system.

The Principal ensures transparency in financial management by involving staff members in the college construction committee and by completing internal and external audits. The account of various funds as examination fund, festival fund, general fund, the magazine fund etc are maintained separately. Those teachers whose posts are yet to be provincialized are offered a consolidated pay-scale.

#### **Institutional Values and Best Practices**

As Barpathar College is aware of its social responsibilities, the Institution carries out extension activities through NSS, Women Cell, IQAC etc with an earnestness to serve the local community. Some such activities are flood relief given by NSS, awareness programme organized by women Cell on Women's health and hygiene in Dubarani Village, Road Safety Awareness Programme in Barpathar Town, cleanliness drive by NSS etc. On the other hand, during covid 19 pandemic, the college had the opportunity to serve as a Quarantine centre with the help of Civil Administration of Dhansiri Sub-Division.

The College observes days as Independence Day, Republic Day, Teacher's Day, International Yoga Day,

World Environment Day, International Mother Language Day, International Women Day etc. Students are always encouraged to plant trees for sake of environment. Seminars, talks and workshops are organized for career counselling, health and hygiene and for gender sensitization.

A. Barpathar College will focus on overall personality development of students by inculcating 21st century skills of learners. Our education would be aimed at developing all capacities of human

	beings:-intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional and moral values in an integrated manner. B. Barpathar College will organize programs to integrate humanities and science with stem, for example by arranging presentations and lectures by resource persons to inculcate basic scientific knowledge among humanities students. C. The institution offers flexible and innovative curricula that includes credit based courses and projects in the areas of community engagement and service, environmental education, and value based education ,as for example Yoga day celebration, Human Rights day celebration ,Women's day celebration, Road safety awareness program , environment day celebration etc. D. The institute will offer a liberal education which can unlock all human capacities- intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional and moral values in an integrated manner. E. The institution plans to find out the problems prevailing among the people in our society and aims to solve these problems by organizing various meetings and awareness campaign. F. In view of NEP 2020 Barpathar College already planed with a Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) with Industrial Training Institute (ITI) which is located back side of the college campus to benefit of the college students that MOU comprised with the training programme of skill development to cope up with the professional activities as well as their academic activities. our college has organized various programs like vermicomposting training, mushroom cultivation training, yoga day celebration, Human rights day celebration, Road safety day celebration etc.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	Till now the institution does not fulfill the requirements of ABC but soon it will be done as the institution started this Process.
3. Skill development:	The institution has introduced Tourism and Travel Management (T.T.M.G) as a Skill Enhancement Course. The institution has also organized some vocational training programs, for example toy making training, painting workshop, vermicomposting training program etc. The institution also provides value based education by celebrating Human Rights day, Women's day, Yoga day etc. Vocational education in ODL for students will be started very soon. The institution is planning

	to introduce some vocational courses with the help of Assam government as a part of degree course to ensure that all students get at least one vocational course before graduating. Till now our college does not have any association with NSDC but in future we have plans to associate with them.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	The institution provides degree for linguistic subjects such as Assamese, English ,Hindi ,but unfortunately we don't have teachers to teach Hindi . All other subjects are taught by teachers in bilingual mode mainly in Assamese and English. The institution conducts various programs on Indian arts, North East culture. We are also trying to integrate Sanskrit and our local endangered languages like Tai language as a part of our college curriculum. Among the good practices of our institution to integrate culture and language with education are the efforts of the faculties to support indigenous endangered languages and the discussions carried out by teachers with the students to highlight about the culture language, food habit and dresses of the 40 different communities who are inhabitants of Assam.
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	Emphasis is placed on a clearly articulated idea of what students are expected to know and be able to do. The institution provides good education to students, session on carrier counseling, training in mushroom cultivation, vermicomposting etc. which will help them when they leave the institution.
6. Distance education/online education:	The institution offers graduate and post graduate distance courses under Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (K.K.H.S.O.U.).

Students are encouraged to participate in various competitions as Quiz competition, Easy writing etc. Moreover, both teaching and no-teaching staff are granted leaves by the college Authority to participate in various types of Electoral training and play roles as Presiding Officer, Polling Officer, Master Trainer for Electoral roles etc. Some of the faculty members perform their duties as Master Trainers in respect of Electoral Voting machine, Voters Verifiable Paper Audit Trial etc.

#### **Response:**

As Barpathar College is affiliated to Dibrugarh University, it follows the curricular prepared by the university. Punctual and effective curricular delivery is sought by the college through a well planned documentation process. The college adheres to the academic calendar issued by Dibrugarh University, where the dates for academic and non-academic activities are mentioned.

- The college yearly publishes a prospectus, which includes all the relevant information about the college. Student fraternity can know about the academic aspects as courses offered, fee structure, departmental information etc. from the prospectus.
- A planned class routine is prepared by consulting all the HODS of the departments.
- All the teachers are instructed to create student-friendly environment in the classroom. Conventional lecture method is used to its utmost by the teachers. Besides this, several forms of experimental learnings as seminars, group discussion, educational tours,. Field studies, speeches by eminent personalities are applied for effective curricular delivery.
- The principal and IQAC constantly monitor the progress of teaching-learning process. All the departments are instructed to complete the course content in the stipulated time.
- As an aid to their learning process, students are counselled by the teachers to use the central as well as the departmental libraries.
- Students' performance is evaluated regularly through unit test and sessional examinations. University examination results are analyzed on regular basis and the faculty members are instructed to opt the suitable measures for better outcome.
- The teachers maintain the record of their daily classes in the form of teacher's diary.
- The college encourages and extends all possible help to the teachers to engage in research oriented activities as orientation programme, refresher course, FIP, FDP etc. Beside ,teachers community of the college is highly inclined to attend various national , state-level ,international seminars , conferences, workshops and present their research papers accordingly

The college adheres to the academic calendar issued by the affiliating university and it is well –implemented. The students are evaluated through two sessional examinations, home assignment, seminars, group discussion and class attendance. The students are informed of such evaluation programme through the notice board.

In the semester course, the university reserves the right to set question of 80% marks in each paper in end semester examination and of the rest 20% marks are left for the colleges as internal assessment. Of this 20% marks, 5% is derived from 1st sessional exam, 5% from 2nd sessional exam, 5% from student's attendances and 5% from seminar/GD/assignment etc.

An orientation programme is carried out by the principal and the teaching and non - teaching staff

at the outset of each new academic session. Newly admitted students are informed in details about the course structure, evaluation process, rules and regulation of the institution etc. in this programme.

# 2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

#### **Response:**

Rules and regulations regarding the evaluation process are created by the University in the meeting of "Board of Studies" and, "Academic Council" and later those are circulated to all the affiliated colleges. The teachers are instructed by the authority to conduct Internal Assessment accordingly. The faculty members apprise the students in their respective classes. In the semester course , the University set questions of 80% marks in each paper and the 20% marks are internal marks awarded by the colleges. Of this 20%,5% are accumulated from 1st sessional, 5% from 2nd sessional ,5% from student's attendance and 5% from group discussion /seminars/symposium etc.

The students can apply for re-evaluation of answer scripts of final examinations as per the University rules and regulations. Besides there is a provision for betterment examination after the completion of the programme. In case of any examinations related grievances, the students can avail the RTI.

The answer scripts of the sessional examinations are shown to the students and their shortcoming are pointed out . Thus, the institutional tries to deal with examination related grievances in a transparent, time –bound and efficient way.

The institution adheres to transparency in the conduct of internal assessment. All the departments execute internal assessment following the rules set by Dibrugarh University. The important aspects of internal assessment are mentioned below:-

- Home assignments are given to the students.
- Two sessional examination are conducted on the topics taught to the students as per the academic calendar of Dibrugarh University.
- Group discussion, seminars, symposium are conducted by the department as a part of Internal Assessment.
- Marks of sessional examination are displayed on the notices boards and answer scripts are shown to students.

- All fees/fines collected by the college administration through bank challans are deposited under the respective heads of accounts.
- The Governing Body take decisions about the fee structure.
- Barpathar college receives funds from Government of Assam,MP and MLA local area development fund. The institution has applied to bodies like ONGC, NRL and the some NGO's for funds and cooperation.
- Quotations are invited from established farms for any new purchase. After a cooperative statement of the tanderd quotation by the purchase committee, the lowest bidder is asked to supply the quoted materials. After receiving the materials only, payment are made through A/C payee cheques.
- The institution / college gives importance on cashless transaction. All payment are made through cheques or NEFT / RTGS by the principal (of the college) and are subjected for approval of Governing Body. In some cases only cash payments are made.

• A construction committee is formed by Governing Body to look after all the construction related matters. For all cinstructions tenders are invited from reputed farms.
